Thanks giving Tyrkey ticket

Object of the activity:

The idea behind a "turkey ticket" is that each person in the family takes some time to reflect on what they are thankful for. There is no right or wrong way to do it. It can be over the span of their lives, or from the past couple weeks or days, but have all (big & small) write down, or draw pictures of what they are thankful for. When it's time to sit down for dinner, set out a jar to collect everyone's ticket. You can place it on the table as a centerpiece, read them out-loud as a family, or just simply take the tickets in exchange for a plate at meal-time. This is a fun, family way to remember to give thanks to God for each and every one of our blessings.

Verges to share at meal-time:

(Choose a couple verses to share at dinner as you reflect on what you are thankful for!)
